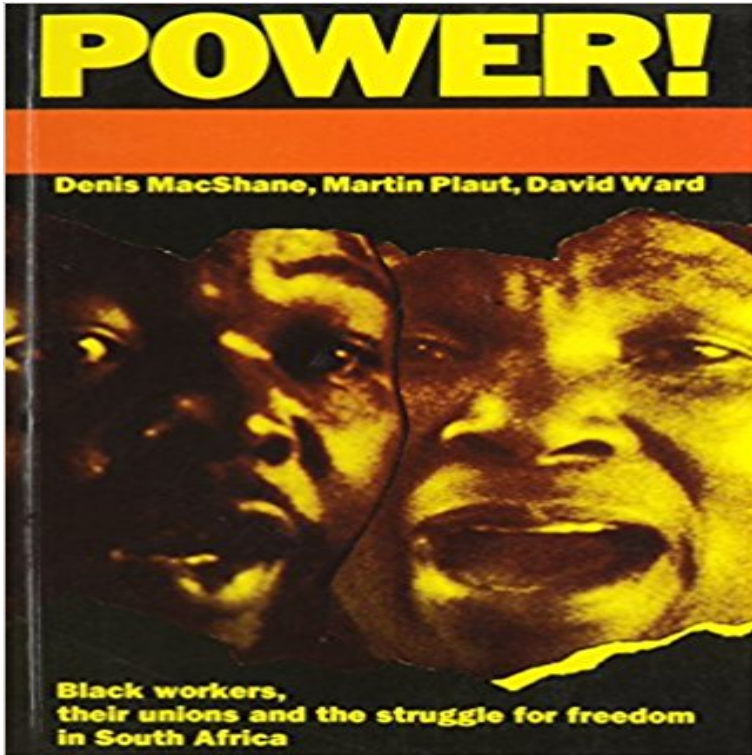


Power!: Black workers, their unions and the struggle for freedom in South Africa
