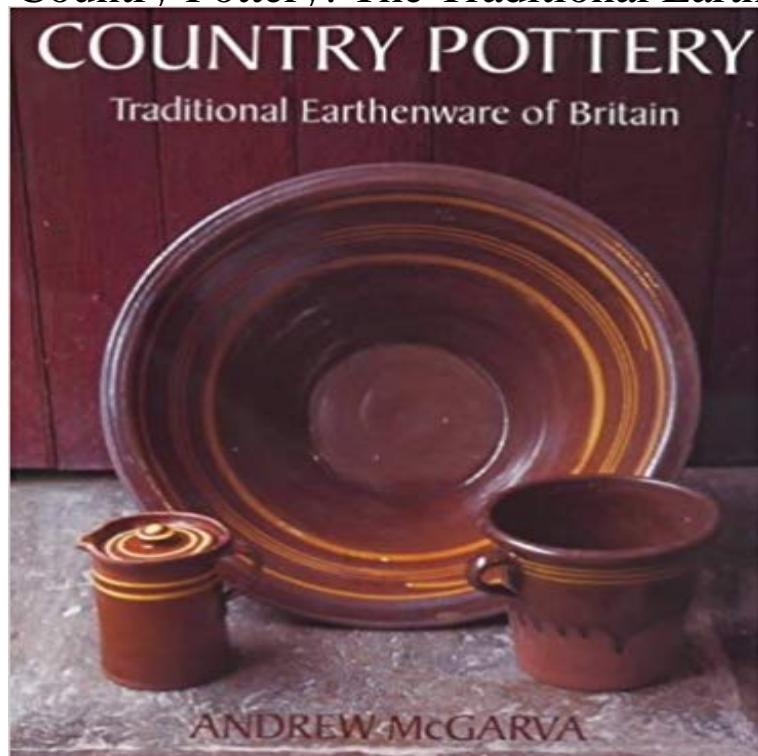


## Country Pottery: The Traditional Earthenware of Britain (Ceramics)
