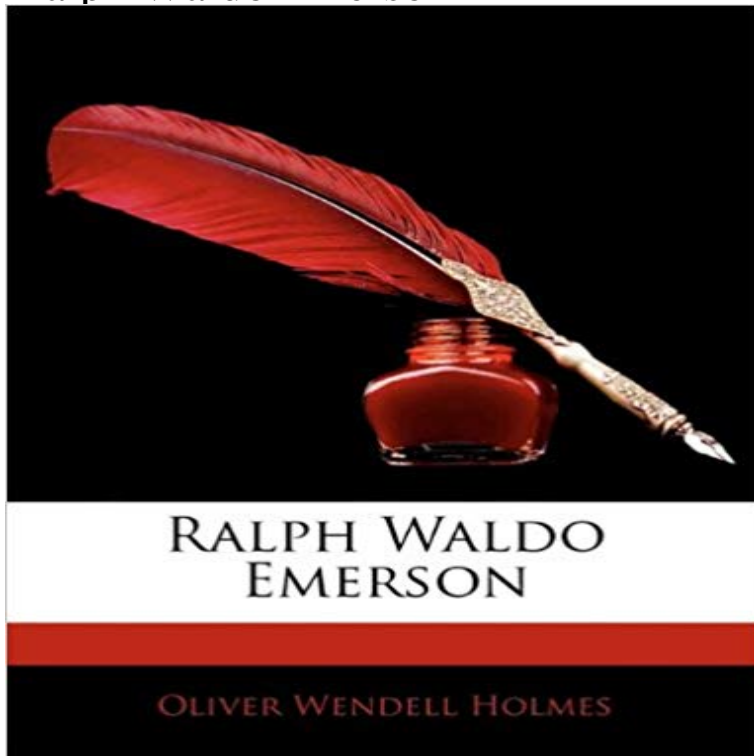


## Ralph Waldo Emerson
