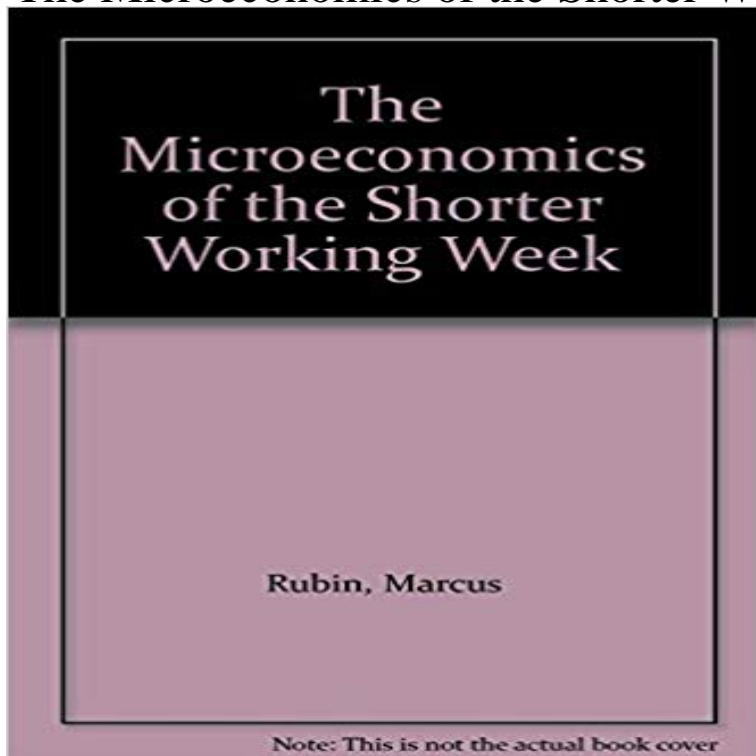


The Microeconomics of the Shorter Working Week
