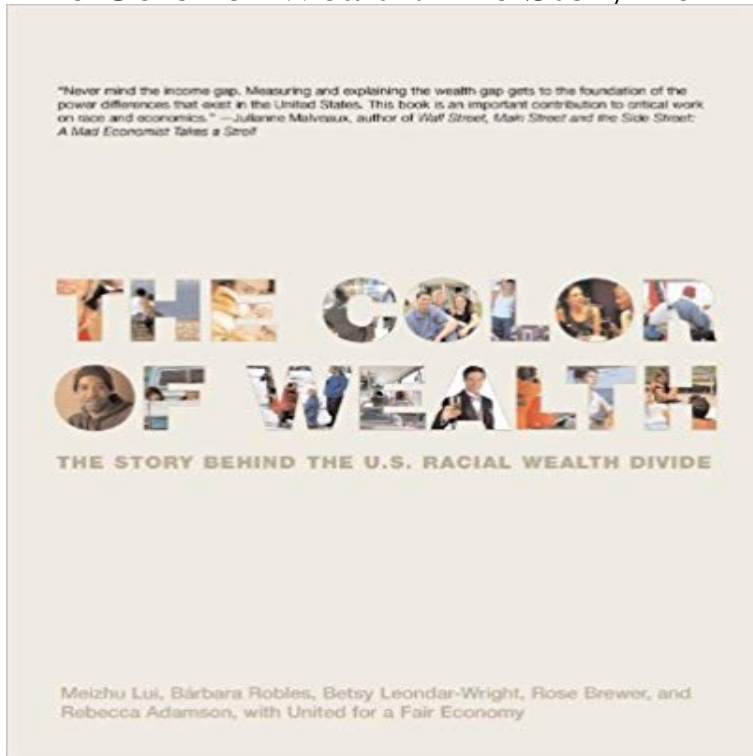


The Color of Wealth: The Story Behind the U.S. Racial Wealth Divide

The Color of Wealth lays bare a dirty secret: for centuries, people of color have been barred by laws and by discrimination from participating in government wealth-building programs that benefit white Americans. Written by five leading experts on the racial wealth divide who recount the asset-building histories of Native Americans, Latinos, African Americans, Asian Americans, and European Americans, this book is a uniquely comprehensive multicultural history of American wealth. With its focus on public policies, show, for example, many post-World War II GI Bill programs helped whites only. The Color of Wealth is the first book to demonstrate the decisive influence of government on Americans' net worth.
