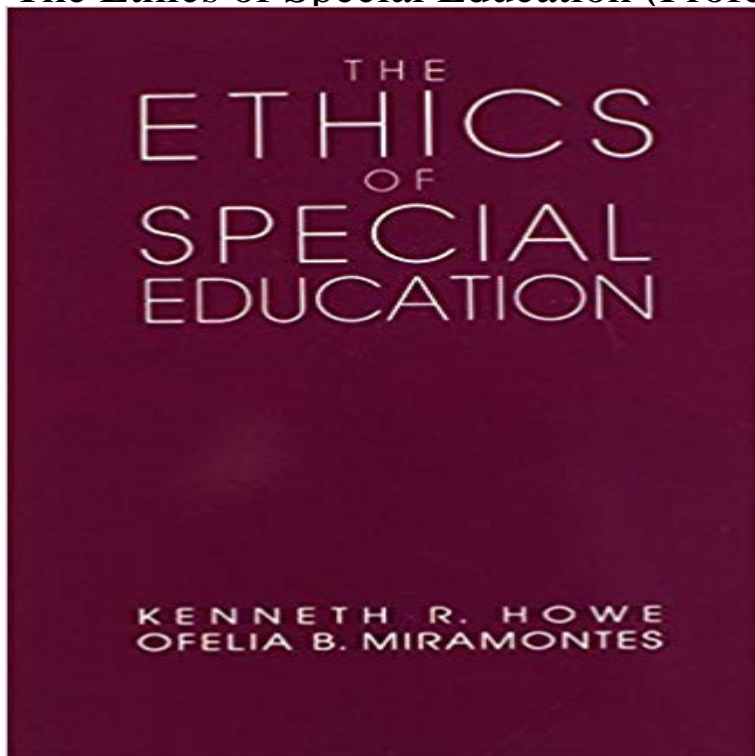


## The Ethics of Special Education (Professional Ethics Series)
