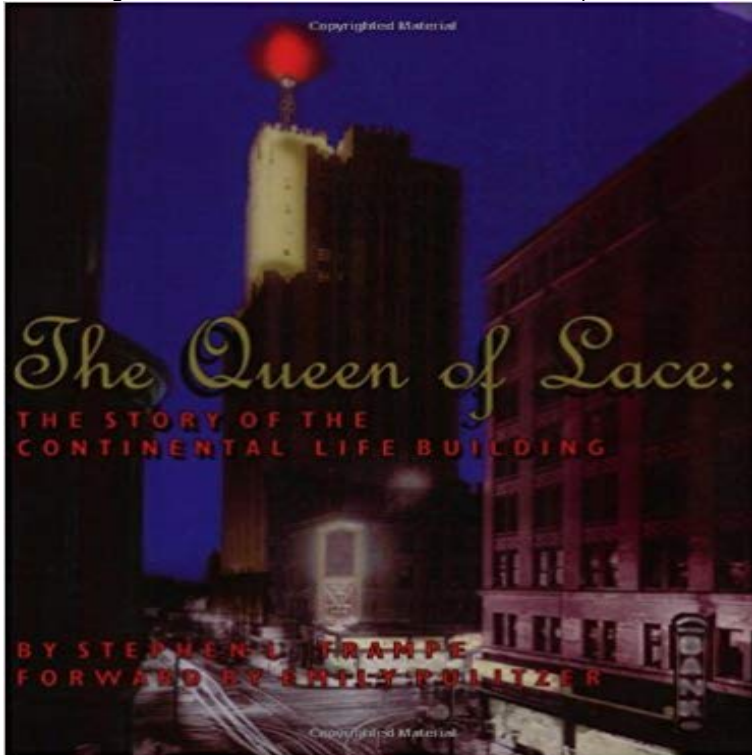


The Queen of Lace: The Story of the Continental Life Building
